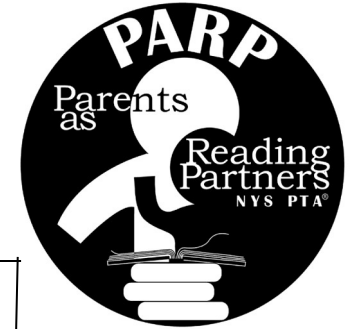

The Olympics began in Ancient Greece. The Olympics began as a festival to honor Zeus, the ruler of the gods in Greek mythology. The first Olympics were held in 776 BC in the city-state of Elis, Olympia. The early Olympics were very simple. There was only one event - a foot-race - called the *stade*.
