LIBRARY & BUDGET VOTE/BOE MEMBER **ELECTION - MAY 21, 2023**

Polls are open from 12:00 p.m. (noon) until 9 P.M. in designated school buildings. Board of Education member vacancies are on the ballot yearly. An election calendar will be issued yearly which will include registration dates, availability of petitions and other pertinent data. A person is entitled to vote at a school district vote/election if he/she is:

- 1. A citizen of the United States.
- 2. Eighteen years of age or older.
- 3. A resident within the school district for 30 days preceding the vote/election.
- 4. Registered with the County Board of Elections or with the school district on the Special Registration Day designated by the school district.

"In accordance with Section 1716 of the Education Law, copies of the school district budget shall be available 14 days preceding the date of the budget vote/election."

OUR PROGRAMS

UNIVERSAL PRE-KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM

The full-day Universal Pre-K (UPK) Program provides a comprehensive and developmentally age-appropriate program for eligible NECSD four-year olds. The daily schedule is thoughtfully planned to support early childhood development and is aligned to NYSED Office of Early Learning program expectations and Standards. The UPK program includes thoughtfully planned purposeful play activities supported by teaching staff who encourage experimentation, exploration and inquiry. A typical day in any of our UPK includes a balance between individual and small group activities, active and quiet activities, and self initiated activities in interest areas/centers. The Universal Pre-K Program contributes to the continuing growth of young children's knowledge and an understanding of themselves and the world in which they live. Learning experiences provide opportunities for children to develop language, literacy, thinking skills, physical abilities, mathematics understanding, and social and emotional learning skills. The Universal Pre-K Program is available at the following elementary schools: Balmville, Gardnertown Leadership Academy, Gidney Avenue Memorial School (GAMS), Horizonson-the Hudson or at our community partners listed below. EXCEPTIONAL LEARNERS

The NECSD is dedicated to the goal of improving educational outcomes for students with disabilities and their families. Students with disabilities are identified through a referral and evaluation process as defined through the New York State Part 200 Regulations.

Once identified, students are eligible to receive instruction, supports, and services designed to provide access to the general education curriculum through the development of an Individualized Education Plan (IEP). As required by law, supports and services are determined based upon the assessed needs and provided in the least restrictive environment in order to enable the student to gain educational benefit.

In the event you suspect your child may be struggling academically, please contact the principal of the school your child attends and request a meeting to discuss possible solutions. Each building has a Response to Intervention (RTI) Team that can determine necessary academic interventions, monitor progress, and/or refer a student to the Committee on Special Education.

If you have any concerns about a preschool or a school aged child with a disability, please call 845-563-8520.

BILINGUAL EDUCATION

The district offers bilingual education (Transitional & Dual Language) and English as a New Language (ENL) programs. The overall goal of these programs is to provide English Language Learners (ELLs) with the necessary language skills to be successful in all aspects of their academics. The Transitional Bilingual education program uses the Spanish language to help transition ELLs to proficiency in English while continuing to develop their cognitive and academic skills with Spanish language support. Transitional Bilingual services are available for Spanish-speaking students at Gardnertown, Gidney Avenue, Meadow Hill, South Middle School, and NFA Main Campus. The Dual Language program aims to build proficiency in both English and Spanish for ELLs and for native English-speaking children. The Dual Language education program uses English and Spanish for literacy and content instruction. The Dual Language program is available at Fostertown School and Vails Gate STEAM Academy. The ENL program provides language support to build English language skills and proficiency. All district schools offer ENL services.

NEWBURGH FREE LIBRARY

The Newburgh Free Library serves all families living in the Newburgh Enlarged City School District and has digital and print resources to help students and their families succeed. Use your free library card to download our Hoopla and Libby Apps to give you access to eBooks, comics, graphic novels, audiobooks, music and much more. Apply for your library card online at www.newburghlibrary.org to reserve Books, DVDs, music, and magazines-available to check out or download. Many more resources are available on our website including Ancestry Family Search, Tutor.com, resume and job search help, civil service tests, driving tests, car repair, Consumer Reports and more! Computers and free WiFi are available on site for personal use and homework help. Technology training classes, one on one technology support, employment workshops, English Language Learning classes and Spanish language materials are available. Photocopying, mobile print, faxing and notary services are also available. FAMILY AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The district is dedicated to the continual development and maintenance of positive and productive home-schoolcommunity connections that increase student achievement and foster the healthy development of children and youth. Parent leadership is encouraged through participation in district-level activities, such as interviews and special project teams, and school-based activities, such as, parentteacher groups and school-based-shared-decision making committees. The district recognizes that parents are their children's first and most important teachers. The district provides opportunities for parent participation through parent engagement and volunteer opportunities. We recognize that children whose parents become actively involved in their education achieve greater success and experience an enhanced quality of family life. Parents are encouraged to spend time in the schools their children attend, and to be engaged in the education of their children through school events, parent-teacher conferences, parentteacher entities (PTO/PTA/PTG/PTC), and district level activities, such as, Parent Connect. ATTENDANCE

As you know, the school district has a policy that outlines the expectations for student attendance. A copy of Policy number 5100 Comprehensive Student Attendance is available on the school district's website at newburghschools.org.

One part of the policy states that, "no individual is authorized to change a student's attendance record beyond five (5) school days after returning to school" (e.g., changing an unexcused absence to an excused absence).

The following are the expectations for written notes explaining an absence. Please provide the required written documentation for the reason your child was absent within five (5) days of their return. Documentation received beyond the five (5) days will no longer be accepted and the student's record will be marked as an unexcused absence(s) for that occurrence. Should you have any questions, please contact your school principal. A student or his/her parent(s)/guardian will have the right to appeal in writing within ten (10) school



days of the student's return to the building principal or designee regarding the accuracy of the number of or type of absences for any class. The building principal or designee's decision may be appealed to the Superintendent of Schools or designee within ten (10) school days of the Principal's determination.

For tardies and early departures, the written excuse should be presented to the school on the day of the tardy or early departure with the reason for the tardy or early departure.

HEALTH SERVICES

School Health Services takes a leadership role in assessing health risk factors and promotes resilience to ensure students achieve optimal health and well being.

A team comprised of a health services facilitator, school physician, school nurse teacher, school nurse practitioner, registered nurse, health aide, and health clerk work collaboratively with parents and the medical and school communities to address the physical, social, emotional, and educational needs of district children and youth in grades Pre-K through 12th.

All district schools have a knowledgeable, well-staffed and well-equipped health office which promotes healthy attitudes and behaviors while emphasizing preventive health care.

DISPENSING OF MEDICATION

Ilf a student must take medication in school during school hours, the medication must be in the original container, with the following information: date prescribed, student's name, name of medication, dose, and time to be administered. A parental permission form and physician's order must accompany all medication.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION

Emergency information cards are sent home the first week of school. This card should be filled in immediately and returned to school. The information on this card will help us contact you in case of an emergency. It is important that you notify the School Health Office of any changes in information during the school year.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION REQUIREMENTS

The N.Y.S. Education Department requires a physical exam for student entry into school at any grade level, for each student entering Pre-K, K, and students in the 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th and 11th grades, sports participation, working permits, and for the Committee on Special Education (CSE) triennial review. A physical exam is valid for one year, through the last day of the month in which the physical was given, except when the student has had an illness or injury lasting more than five days, which will negate this exam. The exam must be administered not more than 12 months prior to the start of the school year in which it is required, and the physical exam form presented within 30 days of entry into school or into any grade referenced above.

SPORTS PHYSICAL EXAMINATION

All students who participate in interscholastic athletics must have a physical exam and/or Health Interval Review as well as receive a clearance notification from the Health Office through the Final Forms registration platform. Except for the summer months, sports physical exams may be obtained in school from the nurse practitioner while school is in session.

SCHOOL ACCIDENT INSURANCE

School accident insurance provides for partial coverage. All expenses incurred must be submitted to parental insurance prior to being submitted to the school insurance company. Parents are responsible for any balance after the school insurance has been processed. All insurance forms should be promptly completed and mailed by parents/guardians to the school insurance company.

IMMUNIZATION EXEMPTIONS

On June 13, 2019, the Governor of New York signed into law legislation that eliminated religious exemptions for immunizations. Please speak with the nurse's office in the building your children attend if you have any questions.

REGISTRATION OFFICE

The Registration Office for the Newburgh Enlarged City School District is located at 124 Grand Street. All students entering the district must begin the registration process online. Applicants are addressed on a first-come first-served basis after submitting the application. Registration hours are from 8:30AM to 3:30PM, Monday through Friday, except holidays in alignment with the school district calendar. Parents or guardians are required to provide the following documentation in order to register their children for school:

1. Proof of Age

- Original or Certified Transcription of your child's Birth Certificate or Baptismal Certificate (regardless of the issuing nation)
- If you are unable to provide either of the above documents, your child's Passport regardless of the issuing nation.
- In the absence of the above documents, you may provide any other documentation that has been in existence for over two years that could be used to establish your child's age. For example:
 - a.) official driver's license or non-driver identification card;
 - b.) state or local government issued identification;
 - c.) military dependent identification card;
 - d.) school photo identification with date of birth:
 - e.) consulate identification cards:
 - f.) hospital or health records;
 - g.) documents issued by federal, state or local agencies (e.g., local service agency, federal Office of Refugee Resettlement);
 - h.) court orders or other court issued documents:
 - i.) Native American tribal document; or
 - j.) records from non-profit international aid agencies and voluntary agencies.

2. Proof of Residency

You must submit at least one (1) of the following documents and at least one (1) item from Supplementary Proof of Residency (below):

- A residential lease (preferably signed within the last 3 months) with current rent receipt (the District reserves the right to also request a Statement of Landlord or Owner, attached)
- A mortgage or deed
- A statement from a landlord concerning your tenancy (Statement of Landlord or Owner is attached)

Supplementary Proof of Residency

You may submit any other relevant evidence you wish to, including but not limited to the following types of documentation with current address to indicate residency:

- Current Utility bill (gas, electric, telephone, cable) with the location of service indicated
- Current Pay Stub with address
- Income Tax Form
- Membership Documents based on residency (e.g., library card)
- · Voter registration documents
- Official Driver's License, learner's permit or non-driver identification
- State or other government issued identification
- Documents issued by federal, state or local agencies (e.g., local social service agency, federal Office of Refugee Resettlement, Social Security SSI, Child Support)

3. Proof of Custody, Guardianship or Foster Care

- If parents are separated, divorced or have a custody order, these documents must be provided to the district
- If foster parents, documents from NYS Office of Children and Family Services (e.g., LDSS-2999)
- If custody/guardianship is with a third party, you
 must complete and submit the attached Affidavits of
 Responsibility (from the parents and custodial persons).
 The District will consider requests for exceptions to this
 requirement in limited but appropriate circumstances.

4. Immunization (Shot) Record

Students who do not have documentation of receiving any, or an insufficient number of, immunizations or proof of immunity may be permitted to attend school for a grace period of not more than 14 calendar days, which may be extended to not more than 30 calendar days for a student who is transferring from out of state or from another country and can show a good faith effort to get the necessary evidence of immunization. (10NYCRR 66-4). After the grace period, the student may be excluded from attendance.

5. Copy of Last Physical Exam

(Must be within 12 months of start of school year)

6. Government Issued Picture ID of the Parent/Guardian

7. If available, Current Report Card, Transcript (and IEP if applicable)

THIS APPLICATION MUST BE SUBMITTED ONLINE. Students may only be registered by a parent, guardian or case worker.

Admission to Pre-Kindergarten is open to those students who turn four (4) years of age on or before December 1st of the school year.

Admission to Kindergarten is open to those students who turn five (5) years of age on or before December 1st of the school year.

INTRODUCTION

Welcome back to our students, families, teachers, and staff! Our food service staff has been working on preparing new recipes and menu items that we hope you will enjoy. This year all grain items will be made from whole grains, and fruit and vegetables will be unlimited! We hope you have the opportunity to visit our cafeterias to see firsthand the dedication our department has in providing fresh healthy meals to our students. We welcome your feedback and look forward to serving you soon!

BREAKFAST

We all know that breakfast is the most important meal of the day so why not get a healthy start by eating breakfast at school? The School Breakfast Program is a great way for children to get the nutrients they need to stay alert and focused in the classroom. Every school in our district offers breakfast at no cost to all students! Students are able to enjoy breakfast in the classroom each morning in all school buildings. A complete breakfast consists of at least 3 components including at least one serving of fruit. Check our monthly menus for breakfast events and promotions!

LUNCH

School lunch provides students with access to a variety of healthy whole grains, fresh fruit and vegetables, lean meats, and low fat dairy items. Lunch is provided to our Pre-K students in the classroom. Students in grades K-5 have six entrée choices each day including the hot lunch special of the day, the entree salad of the day, the lunch "kit" of the day, ham and cheese or turkey and cheese sandwich made with Boar's Head deli meats, peanut butter and jelly sandwich, or the vegan lunch "kit". Middle school students are offered a second hot lunch option daily in addition to the K-5 options. Students at NFA have entrée specials at each of four stations: Favorites, Pizzeria, International, and a made to order Deli. A variety of healthy sides including red/orange veggies, dark green veggies, legumes, fresh fruit, and low fat milk will be available to all students daily. A complete lunch consists of at least three components including at least one serving of a fruit or vegetable. Lunch is available to all students at no cost.

PREPAYMENT

Although lunch and breakfast are available at no cost, you may deposit any amount of money in your child's individual account for a'la carte snack and beverage items. Your child's PIN number is their student ID number. He or she will enter this number when they arrive at the cashier. The amount spent for a'la carte snacks will then be debited from the account. Parents of elementary school students should help their children memorize their student ID number. When students know their number, the lunch lines move efficiently.



ONLINE PREPAYMENT

The district offers MySchoolBucks, an online service that allows you to securely pay for your student's snacks online using your credit/debit card or electronic check. Sign up now and you can:

BUS SAFETY RULES

The safety of our students is our primary concern. To help ensure the safety of all students, other motorists and the general public, please make sure your child is aware of the following regulations:

Any student who does not follow these guidelines may lose the privilege of riding the bus.

Bus Safety Rules for Riding the Bus

- 1. Students must follow the instructions of their driver.
- 2. Students must remain in their seats while the bus is in motion, keeping aisles clear at all times.
- 3. Students must remain quiet and orderly; stop, look and listen with the bus driver at all railroad crossings.
- Students must be courteous to the bus driver and fellow passengers. No fighting, yelling or throwing objects. Foul language or rude behavior will not be tolerated.
- 5. Students are not permitted to smoke, eat or drink on the bus and must help to keep the bus neat and clean.

Bus Safety Rules for the Bus Stop

- 1. Students must leave home early enough to arrive at the bus stop ten minutes before the bus is due.
- Students must wait for their bus well off the roadway and respect the property of others.
- 3. Students must enter the bus in a single file and in an orderly manner.
- 4. When leaving the bus, if students must cross a street they should walk 10 feet in front of the bus. Look both ways and wait for the driver to signal approval to cross. A child must never attempt to return to the bus unless instructed to do so by the driver.

The district is required to follow the "No-Fault Law" for students receiving medical attention as a result of a school bus accident/incident. The "No-Fault Law" provides that if you are injured on a bus or a school bus in New York State, no-fault benefits must be paid by your auto-insurer, or if you have no auto, the auto insurance of a relative with whom you reside. The law further provides that you should only file a no-fault claim with the bus company if there is no such auto-policy in your household.

NON-PUBLIC SCHOOL BUS REQUESTS

In accordance with New York State Education Law, transportation request forms for children in non-public schools must be submitted by April 1st for the following school year to be eligible for transportation unless the family moves into the district after April 1st, in which case the request must be made within 30 days of establishing residency. Transportation requests received after April 1st are not guaranteed transportation. If transportation is provided based on a late request it will be to and from a central pick up and drop off location. Students must be 5 years of age by December 1 of the current school year to be eligible for bus transportation.

EMERGENCY "GO HOME" PROCEDURES

When, due to unusual circumstances, the Superintendent of Schools decides that it is necessary to close schools during the school day or before the usual time, the following procedures will be followed:

- 1. Our radio stations may inform you of school closings.
- A School Messenger message will be sent. A posting will also be made on the district website and social media.
- Students who ordinarily walk will be dismissed immediately.
- All bus students will be transported to their usual home stops.

Please observe the following safety regulations:

- 1. Remain calm and stay at home.
- Please do not call the school or the Board of Education Office.
- 3. When possible, make every effort to be at the bus stop to meet your child. Students in Pre-K Grade 2 and all students taking special transportation must be met at the bus stop.
- If you plan to be away from home at any time, your child should be made aware of another home where he or she can be cared for until your return.

DISMISSAL

Children will only be released to those individuals on the emergency blue card. Students in Pre-K - Grade 2 and all students taking special transportation must be met at the bus stop.

SCHOOL CLOSING INFORMATION

The days that the district will not be in session are clearly noted on the September through June calendar. At times, special closings for workshops, conference days or other school district activities, could take place during the school year. On these occurrences, notes will be sent home by each school principal.

During inclement weather the school district will normally be open for students and staff. Normal amounts of rain and snow will not be the criteria for school closings. If snow and ice are excessive and could present a hazardous situation for students and staff to travel to school, the Superintendent of Schools will reach a decision about closing the schools. This decision is reached after careful consideration of the weather, the conditions of the streets and roads, and the ability of buses and cars to travel throughout the district. The closing of schools will be announced on the radio and television stations listed below. The district also uses the School Messenger services via telephone for announcements. This is a service that enables the district to send messages to thousands of staff and parents quickly. If our district does not close because of inclement weather, there will be no radio. television, social media, or website announcement.



Did You Know?

The district uses the following methods to communicate school closings, delays, and emergency news: District website, Facebook, local radio stations, local television stations, phone calls, and emails. Make sure your information is updated in your Parent Portal account to receive these alerts.

FAMILY NOTIFICATIONS

All NYS Schools are required to notify parents of certain policies and procedures each year. Previously a Parent Notification Booklet was available online and at each school building. We've combined that booklet with our district calendar to give families better access to this important information.

STUDENT PARTICIPATION IN MANDATED ASSESSMENTS

Parents/Guardians have the right to request information regarding the State and the district's policy on participation in required assessments, and the policy or procedure to opt out of those assessments, if applicable. Information on all required assessments, both state and local, are posted on the district website.

GRADUATION CEREMONIES

The district is required to provide families the district policies on participation on graduation ceremonies for those students who have earned CDOS or SACC. BULLYING AND HARASSMENT

The Board of Education is committed to providing an educational and working environment that promotes respect, dignity and equality. The Board recognizes that



discrimination, such as harassment, hazing and bullying, are detrimental to student learning and achievement.

These behaviors interfere with the mission of the district to educate its students and disrupt the operation of the schools. Such behavior affects not only the students who are its targets but also those individuals who participate and witness such acts.

To this end, the Board condemns and strictly prohibits all forms of discrimination, such as harassment, hazing and bullying on school grounds, school buses and at all school-sponsored activities, programs and events.

Discrimination, harassment, hazing or bullying that takes place at locations outside of school grounds which can be reasonably expected to materially and substantially interfere with the requirements of appropriate discipline in the operation of the school or impinge on the rights of other students are prohibited, and may be subject to disciplinary consequences.

PESTICIDE APPLICATIONS

Pursuant to the Pesticide Notification Law, the Newburgh Enlarged City School District is informing through this written notice all persons in parental relation to our students that, during the course of the year, it might become necessary for a school to use pesticide products. The District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation who wish to receive 48- hour prior written notice of certain pesticide applications.

The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- · anti-microbial products
- non-volatile rodenticides in tamper-resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children
- non-volatile insecticidal baits in tamper-resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children
- silica gel and other non-volatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children
- boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate
- the application of EPA-designated biopesticides
- the application of EPA-designated exempt materials under 40 CFR §152.25
- the use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets

In addition, there will be no written notice of an application when a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72 hours period following the application. In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good- faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

If you would like to receive 48-hour prior notification of pesticide applications that are scheduled to occur in your child's school, please complete the Pesticide Notice Form available on the district's website and return it to the school (please include your address, telephone #, e-mail address, and/or fax number).

APPR OF TEACHERS AND PRINCIPALS

In accordance with the federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), parents/guardians of students have the right to request specific information about the professional qualifications of their children's classroom teachers and/or principal, including the composite APPR score.

Right to Request and Review Information Regarding Teacher

In accordance with the federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), parents/guardians of students have the right to request specific information about the professional qualifications of their children's classroom teachers. As the parent/guardian of a student in the Newburgh Enlarged City School District, you have the right to request the following information about your child's/children's teachers:

- whether the teacher has met New York State qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas he or she teaches;
- whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which the State qualifications or licensing criteria have been waived;
- the teacher's college major;
- whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees;
- if your child is provided services by any instructional aides or similar paraprofessionals, the services provided to your child and the aide's or paraprofessional's qualifications.

Requests for information about the qualifications of your child's/children's teacher(s) should be directed to the Main Office of the school of attendance. Thank you for your continued support and interest in your child's/children's education.

ANAPHYLAXIS

The Newburgh Enlarged City School District is legally authorized to employ Nurse Practitioners, School Nurse Teachers and Registered Nurses to provide the nursing service of administering anaphylactic treatment agents. All Nurse Practitioners, School Nurse Teachers and Registered Nurses employed by the Newburgh Enlarged City School District may administer epinephrine via a designated or an undesignated epinephrine auto-injector to an individual using professional judgment if an individual is experiencing a potentially life-threatening allergic reaction (anaphylaxis).

Each Nurse Practitioner, School Nurse Teacher and Registered Nurse will be covered by the non-patient specific standing order only while working in the Newburgh Enlarged City School District employment situation. This standing order will be in effect for one year, from September 1 until August 31. Each nurse will hold a current CPR Certification and will follow the Health Services Policy and Protocol for immunizations.

For an Anaphylactic Reaction to Immunizations, TB test, Allergens, Insect Bite, Exercised Induced or Idiopathic give:

For individuals 33 to 66 pounds, use one EpiPen Jr. (0.15 mL epinephrine injection, USP, 1:2000) auto-injector to deliver 0.15 mg of epinephrine injection.

For individuals approximately 66 pounds and greater, use one EpiPen® (0.3 mL epinephrine injection, USP, 1:1000) auto-injector to deliver 0.3 mg of epinephrine injection.

Call 911 and transport to Emergency Department via Ambulance. If not breathing and/or pulse ceases, begin CPR.





STUDENT PRIVACY AND DATA

Several laws and regulations protect the confidentiality of information about your children when that information identifies them. Such information, which includes student-specific data, is known as "personally identifiable information" or "PII."

The federal laws that protect your child's PII include the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA), the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA), and the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). State laws, such as N.Y. Education Law 2-d and the related regulations of the N.Y. State Commissioner of Education; and the DOE Chancellor's Regulation A-820 also protect the confidentiality of your child's PII.
