General Statement of Duties

This position ensures high expectations and legal compliance across the Special Education continuum by providing structural oversight, instructional leadership, and cross-functional coordination. The Assistant Superintendent will ensure:

- Full compliance with federal and state Special Education laws, including IDEA, Section 504, Part 200 Regulations, and ADA mandates.
- The district's adherence to legal timelines, procedural safeguards, and due process rights for students with disabilities and their families.
- Oversight of the development, implementation, and monitoring of Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) in accordance with legal standards.
- Supervision of instruction and equitable service delivery to students with disabilities.
- Development and facilitation of professional learning, with an emphasis on legal requirements, compliance, and best practices.
- Collaboration with internal and external legal counsel to manage disputes, mediation, and impartial hearings.
- Transparent, proactive communication with stakeholders, including families, school staff, community organizations, and regulatory bodies.
- Strategic leadership in ensuring related services, transition planning, and access to inclusive opportunities are provided in accordance with the law.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1) Ensures the proper compliance to all Special Education laws and regulations and supervises the Exceptional Learner Division
- 2) Complete all NYSED required data collection reports and use the data to inform improvements
- 3) Develop and implement a professional learning plan for all department staff
- 4) Provide recommendations to the Superintendent and the Policy Committee on the updating of District Regulations, policies and procedures
- 5) Maintain knowledgeable of all Freedom of Information Law requirements
- 6) Ensure Medicaid compliance
- 7) Develop instructional delivery models based on programs on the district continuum
- 8) Ensures that all financial planning is completed collaboratively with the finance division and general/federal funding is leveraged
- 9) Will effectively communicate with District stakeholders including but not limited to parents, staff, media and members of the business community
- 10) Will participate on the Health and Safety Committee
- 11) Additional duties as assigned by the Superintendent
- 12) Oversee and evaluate program effectiveness using quantitative and qualitative data to ensure student outcomes improve across all subgroups, including students with disabilities
- 13) Lead strategic planning and development of district-wide initiatives to expand access to inclusive settings, differentiated instruction, and specialized services.
- 14)Coordinate and supervise out-of-district placements, ensuring appropriate services, alignment with IEPs, and cost-efficiency.
- 15) Manage compliance audits and corrective action plans in response to State Education Department reviews or due process complaints.
- 16) Develop and sustain cross-departmental collaboration, including Teaching & Learning, Human Resources, and Technology, to

enhance the delivery of supports to exceptional learners.

- 17) Provide leadership in crisis intervention, behavior management systems, and trauma-informed practices in collaboration with mental health and pupil services teams.
- 18) Supervise and support Special Education leadership personnel, including Coordinators, Supervisors, and CSE Chairs, through regular performance evaluations and coaching.
- 19)Ensure equitable access to resources, including adaptive technologies, instructional materials, and certified staff, across all buildings.
- 20)Lead recruitment, onboarding, and retention efforts for highly qualified special education teachers, related service providers, and instructional assistants.
- 21)Coordinate legal consultation and represent the district in impartial hearings, mediation, or settlement conferences as needed.
- 22)Foster family and community engagement, including oversight of Special Education Parent Advisory Councils (SEPAC) and multilingual parent outreach initiatives.
- 23) Monitor trends in special education litigation, state and federal legislation, and propose responsive district policy and practice changes.
