Vocabulary:

Gidney Avenue Memorial School is dedicated to expanding students' vocabulary knowledge and usage across all grade levels. Families can support this growth by reading together and discussing new words, playing word games like "I Spy" and Mad Libs, labeling objects around the house to build automatic word recognition, and practicing writing sentences and stories using new vocabulary.

Here are some words your scholar will encounter this month:

Grades K & 1: curve, discover, disappointed, embarrassed, celebrate, consequences, decide, divide

Grades 2 & 3: conclusion, connection, continue, cooperation, data, describe, detail, diagram, compare, construct, continent, contract, credit, culture, dangle, defend

Grades 4 & 5: brief, burrow, calculate, circular, clever, confirm, convince, critical, decrease, delicate, demonstrate, descend, banquet, beverage, bland, briskly, budge, cease, century, claim, companion, comply, conclude, conduct

Writing:

We are dedicated to improving writing skills across all grade levels. One great way to support your child at home is by encouraging them to keep a daily journal or diary. They can write about their day, share their thoughts, or create fun stories! Regular writing helps build confidence, expand vocabulary, and boost creativity. To make it even more enjoyable, try writing alongside your child or asking questions about their entries to encourage deeper thinking.



PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE CONTINUED

Math:

At Gidney Avenue Memorial School, we are committed to developing a community of confident problem solvers who can analyze, interpret and solve math word problems across all mathematical domains. Strengthening these critical thinking skills not only supports success in math but also builds a strong foundation for real-world problem solving.

Try This at home: "Think Aloud" Together

One simple yet powerful strategy to support your child's problem-solving skills is to use a "think aloud" approach when working through word problems. Read a problem together and pause to model your thinking process out loud. Ask questions like:

- -"What is the problem asking me to find?"
- -"What information do I already know?"
- -"What strategy could I use to solve this?"

Then, invite your child to try thinking aloud too. This encourages them to slow down, analyze the problem step by step, and become more confident in explaining their reasoning. When math becomes a conversation, students begin to understand it more deeply - and that's when the learning really sticks!
