Program Overview:

The **Kappa Upsilon Lambda Foundation** 501(c)(3) (also known as the KUL Foundation) is the charitable arm of the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., Kappa Upsilon Lambda Chapter. The foundation was created under the principles of providing service and advocacy for communities in the Mid-Hudson Valley Area of New York. Through the Foundation, the Chapter has developed and supports a number of initiatives that are in alignment with the premise of the Fraternity's "Go To High School, Go To College" National Program including the **Christopher J. - Brother Richard F. Peterson Memorial Scholarship (Applicant must be a minority male, College-Bound, Graduating High School Senior with at least an A Average and a <u>STRONG</u> list of Community Service accomplishments in the Mid-Hudson Valley Area).

Eligibility:

In order to apply for the scholarship, an applicant must be a male from a traditionally under-represented community and submit a completed application, and be a candidate for graduation from an accredited public or private high school in the Mid-Hudson Valley Area. Applications will be considered based on the following; documented financial need, live and work in diverse environments, exceptional leadership skills, scholarship and a commitment to community service.

Application Process:

- Submission of a completed **KUL Foundation Scholarship Application** consisting of:
 - An application cover sheet signed by both the student and a parent or legal guardian
 - Completed short answer questions
 - Official school transcript in a sealed envelope
 - Two (2) Letters of Recommendation

Finalists for the scholarship will be contacted by the Chair of the Scholarship Committee to participate in an interview.
